THE PRAIRIE ENTHUSIASTS, INC. Definition of Buffer Land

Recommended by TPE Land Protection Committee to TPE Board: 10/17/2011 Adopted by TPE Board of Directors: 1/25/2012

Land being added to a TPE preserve shall be considered to be buffer land when it

1) Does not have any natural communities or rare species habitat of meaningful conservation significance and one or both of the following:

2) Does provide buffering against the negative impacts of adjacent incompatible land uses on the preserve's primary conservation targets (species or communities) and/or

3) Does, or would after restoration, provide additional "elbow room" for the preserve's conservation targets to move into, thereby expanding habitat and populations, and thus enhancing chances of long-term viability of the conservation targets.
