



## Parsnip Predator™

## **Instructions**

Thank you for buying the Parsnip Predator. This tool was designed to aid the extraction of moderate-sized tap-rooted weeds (wild parsnip, thistle, Queen-Anne's lace). It has been field tested and found to yield excellent results.

Please follow these instructions:

- 1) Place the blade 1-2 inches from base of plant.
- 2) Angle the blade so the slicing-edge will intercept the root 2-3 inches underground.
- 3) Apply steady, even pressure to penetrate the ground & slice the root.
- 4) Pull the weed vertically out by hand.
- 5) Remove the Predator from the ground at the same angle it went in.

The Predator functions best when used solely for slicing. It has a narrow blade intended for that purpose only. Do not pry with it as a regular shovel! Work cautiously on rocky ground, this presents the most resistance; sudden force may bend the blade.

Large-rooted plants like burdock may exceed the capability of the Predator. If you use the tool on large plants, go slowly and avoid bending the blade.
