Among the picturesque valleys and bluffs of the Coulee Region lie some of the rarest native habitats in North America: bluff prairies, sand prairies and oak savannas. Only a few islands of these resilient habitats remain, but many imperiled species depend on them to survive—from timber rattlesnakes to rare grassland birds. Caring for these prairies extends a lifeline to one of our natural communities and gives you a chance to reconnect with wild Wisconsin.

Whatever your skills or schedule, we invite you to join our active community and transform your love for nature into action. Typical volunteer activities include removing invasive species, seed collecting, prescribed burning, and tabling at local events.
