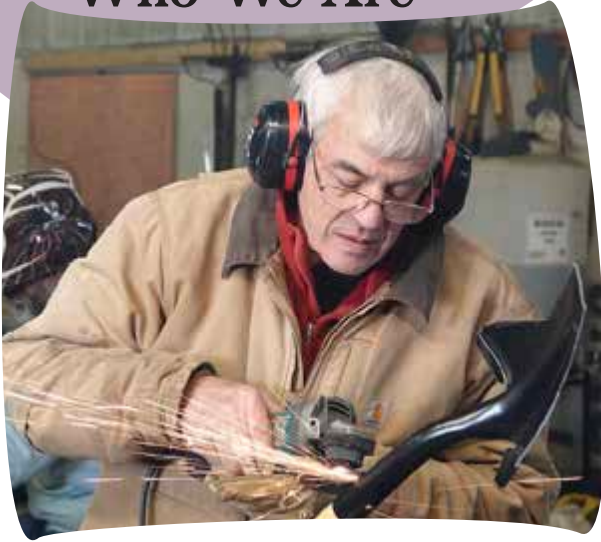

We proudly steward 11 local sites, from high bluff prairies to low-lying wetlands. In a region dramatically transformed by agriculture, these sites are the last remnants of a once-vast plain of grasslands shaped by ancient ice and waters. We invite you to join us in ensuring the survival of these native habitats and the wildlife who depend on them.

Volunteer activities include clearing invasive species, collecting native seed, prescribed burning, and creating Parsnip Predators—a specialized shovel invented by our chapter to take down invasive species fast. Visit our website or scan the QR code on the back panel to get involved.
